Key points about this verse:

Context:

Paul wrote this verse while imprisoned, demonstrating his ability to find peace and contentment despite his difficult situation.

• Focus on God's strength:

The verse emphasizes that the strength to overcome challenges comes from Christ, not from oneself.

• Not about personal achievement:

It doesn't mean you can accomplish anything you set your mind to without limitations, but rather that you can face life's difficulties with God's support.

SO WHAT? Why does it matter to God and to us?

SCRIPTURE | John 1:43-51 (Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael) - Heather

• Hey everyone, welcome to another *What Can I Do?* Career Day! We are going to learn about another cool profession out there that you might be interested in knowing more about. Then, we will talk about how it relates to a story about

Jesus!

- (share about your job or your role as a parent and how knowing the people you serve or your kids is an important part of what you do. How does knowing them help you know what is best for them?)
- That's where our Bible story for today will help us remember that Jesus knows us the best of all. Let's check out John 1:43-51. (have kids look this up in thier bibles)
- Today's story shows Jesus starting to gather disciples, or followers. The two in particular whom we meet are Philip and Nathanael. Philip got to meet Jesus first. He was so excited that he had met the long-awaited Messiah, or Savior! So what did he do? He ran to tell Nathanael about it.
- But Nathanael didn't believe him at first. He thought Jesus was just some guy from Nazareth — how could he be the Messiah? — so Philip urged him to come and see for himself.
- When Nathanael met Jesus, he found out that Jesus already knew him very well.
 Like, really, really well. Jesus already knew that Nathanael was an honest guy and

 random fun fact
 Jesus also knew Nathanael had been under a fig tree before

 Philip came over to talk to him!
- Nathanael knew at once that Jesus was definitely not an ordinary anything. He
 could only be the Son of God and the one everyone had been waiting for.
 Nathanael was able to trust Jesus because he saw that Jesus really knew and
 understood him!

DISCUSSION

Introduce yourself

Really focus on discussion this week

- SCRIPTURE QUESTIONS
 - What did Philip say about Jesus to Nathanael? (That he found the one all the prophets had been talking about Jesus, the Messiah, the Savior.)
 - What did Jesus already know about Nathaniel? (That he was a man without deceit, that he was under a fig tree.)
 - Why do you think this convinced Nathanael that Jesus was the real

deal? (Possible response: Jesus knew things nobody could have known unless he was sent by God.)

• APPLICATION QUESTIONS

- Can you think of something you want to talk to God about that you might not feel comfortable sharing with anyone else?
- What is something you can do to know Jesus more?

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Ask for prayer requests. Then pray together, pray for any requests the kids have.

• Jesus, thank you for knowing me better than I know myself. Even though you created the world, you still make time to know and love me. Everything you make is special, including me. Please help me to know and love you as much as you know and love me. Amen.

REFLECTION | Can I Trust Jesus Knows Me?

- **INSTRUCTIONS:** give each kid a star outline. have them write thier name on it and decorate it.
- How do you feel knowing that the same God who created the earth, sun, sky, and all of the stars also created you?
- How do you feel knowing that God thinks about you more than there are grains of sand on the beach?
- God knows the number of stars in the sky and how many grains of sand there are.
 That's too easy for God. But God also knows you, your thoughts, your dreams, and everything about you that makes up who you are. And God thinks you're pretty wonderful.
- Whenever you feel misunderstood or unknown, tell yourself, "I can trust Jesus knows me and that's more than enough!"
